Workshop Objectives:

Day 1: To work with catchment stakeholders to generate a broad set of current and future requirements or desirables, for monitoring and managing the catchment which frame decision support needs.

Day 2: To reflect the stakeholder requirements into the plans for the INTCATCH project, the decision support system and identify any gaps in planned actions.

Outline Plan – Day 1 – 10.15am – 4:30pm

Arriving around 9:30 for tea, coffee and a networking before we start at 10.15am. Lunch will be provided. The morning session will:

- Introduce the INTCATCH project,
- Ask participants to share their knowledge of the issues which are affecting water quality monitoring and management in the catchment from a range of points of view;
- Capture ideas on what a robust monitoring and management plan would be if anything was possible; and,
- Seek to understand the barriers to delivering this monitoring and management plan.

The afternoon session will use the information from the morning session to explore potential future scenarios, and to consider the actions that a 'catchment manager'¹ may want or need to take, and therefore the **decisions** that would be involved in that. We will generate catchment-monitoring needs from the morning session. A range of monitoring tools will be introduced. The day will then close with a presentation from Technital, one of the INTCATCH partners, to show how they have used decision support systems to deliver outcomes.

Outline Plan – Day 2 – 9:30 – 13:00

Day 2 is for the INTCATCH project partners, but stakeholders are welcome to join if they wish. The session will cover what was learnt from day 1, how this can be considered in the INTCATCH project and what gaps there are in the project. Key actions for the project will be agreed.
